A new school year begins! Parents, students and teachers all face a myriad of emotions as the first day of school approaches. EDUCATION PROGRAM - Recommendations for student success--the home, the church, and the school," by Michael D. Buford, BA, MEd.

What Parents should do in the Home for Student Success in the classroom

- a. Establish/Maintain a Home Educational Environment (HEE)
- Follow Student Study Skills (SSS) Guidelines daily
 Monitor Individual Education Plan Contract (IPAC) daily
- Monitor amount of time student studies and completes homework assignments, daily
- Monitor student attendance and provide positive reinforcement
- Monitor student behavior and provide positive reinforcement
- g. Contact school "immediately" via e-mail, note, phone, or conference on the first signs of student poor progress in academics, attendance, behavior

Suggestions for church leaders to assist their student members for greater success in the classroom

- a. Pastor states something positive about education weekly during morning worship
- Pastor has a vehicle to recognize student academic success; i.e. every six weeks honor roll call announced in the church; verbal/non-verbal positive reinforcements
- c. Pastor posts examples of students' success in academics/ attendance/behavior somewhere in the church each month; i. Sunday School Bulletin Board
- d. Church has a computer station and/or library accessible to school age students in the church to be used after school and on Saturdays
- e. Pastor encourages students to visit regularly the community/ county library (may involve youth in a field trip to the county library to get library cards)
- f. Pastor promotes "good oral reading" in the church and provides excellent examples via church announcements, scripture readings, Sunday School teachers, etc.
- g. Pastor encourages their church leaders to reinforce education skills during Sunday School and Youth Bible Study; i.e. Q/A, analysis, synthesis, inference, evaluation, map skills, dictionar skills, drawing conclusions, in Sunday School; etc.

Suggestions for the public school to work cooperatively with parents to increase student success

- School provides all necessary contact information to parents for teachers, counselors, attendance office, administrators,
- School provides forum(s) for parents to meet school staff in an informal environment prior to the beginning of school, during the school year, and prior to end of school
- c. School provides "special tutorials" for students at a times which are "parent friendly"
 d. School provides a "homework hotline" for parents to check
- weekly, daily, and special assignments
- e. School communicates monthly with parents regarding student progress via individual classroom progress reports or as needed
- f. School is proactive regarding potential problems with behavio attendance/grades contacting parents at the early signs of sai
- School actively provides positive reinforcement for students/ parents in their active participation and communication with the school regarding issues or concerns and a consistent basi

In The Historical Clarksville Community, Austin, TX



Descendants of the historical Clarksville Community celebrated a family union, July 14 – 16, 2017, in Austin, TX, at the Mary Francis (Freeman) Baylor Park, the Pauline Brown Neighborhood Center, and the Sweet Home Missionary Baptist Church, Rev. Steve Manning, Pastor. The three-day event brought together for the first-time grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great grandchildren and their relatives to celebrate the legacy of the union of John "Paw" Freeman and Mary Stevenson Freeman of Austin, TX. The Descendants of the historical Clarksville Stevenson Freeman of Austin, TX. The family reunion included a meet and greet at the MR. CATFISH IN MORE on Airport Avenue; a family picnic and competitive



games at the MARY FRANCIS (FREEMAN) BAYLOR PARK, and a Special Worship Service celebrating the 146th Church Anniversary & Homecoming at the historic SWEET HOME MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH.

The Freeman family were among the original pioneers of the Clarksville community. Emancipated African Americans founded Clarksville in 1871, just six years after the end of the Civil War. Two landmarks celebrating this heritage have subsequently been given markers by the Texas Historical Commission: the Haskell House, which was built by freedman PeterTucker in 1875 and stands as an example of vernacular African American architecture during this era, and the Sweet Home Missionary Baptist Church, which has been in continuous operation since the 1880s. Many memories were shared during the reunion particularly among the grandchildren and great grandchildren via special photo displays, family albums, and a power point presentation given by Latricia (Ferguson) Williams, the Freeman Family Historian. Many of the grandchildren and great

grandchildren in attendance at the reunion lived in the Clarksville community prior to two major events which drastically changed it. doctors, lawyers, nurses, businessmen and women, professors of universities, teachers, preachers, news anchors, law ent officers, real estate agents, coaches, enforcement professional athletes, military personnel and many, many more positions in the technology, food service and health care arenas. These accomplishments and the faith and fortitude needed to achieve them were shared especially with fourth and fifth generations of the FREEMAN FAMILY.

The family reunion also addressed the many changes which have occurred in the Clarksville Community which so many use to call home. In 1968, the city announced plans to build a highway along both sides of the Missouri Pacific Railroad. Though heavily protested by Clarksville residents, the highway was built in the early 1970s, resulting in the destruction of over one-third of homes in the destruction of over one-third of homes in Clarksville. Since then, with the advent of six and seven figure homes and skyrocketing



property values, many older residents have been forced to move out of Clarksville. Throughout these changes, the spirit of Clarksville's African-American community has lived on through the weekly services at Sweet Home Missionary Baptist Church and other community and family gatherings. It was this setting that many of the FREEMAN FAMILY TREE family congregated together after many years and many deaths. This setting also afforded many of the descendants of the FREEMAN FAMILY the first time to visit the community where their forefathers settled, were raised, went to school, worked, and worshipped. It is a tradition long overdue with the hope that it will continue for many generations to come.

Version, the New American Standard; and of course, the New Living Translation. While I am also aware of the fact that the NLT is a translation, I also know how to refer to the original text for not only clarity, but accuracy. So, if the translation does not take away from what the text is saying, I personally have no problem with it; especially since most people today don't speak the King's English and have no idea what you are referring to when you get

to the "Thee" and "Thou" parts of the KJV. So, when I came across this pregnant verse of scripture that was tucked away inside the longest chapter in the Bible, (which is probably why most people skip over it), I couldn't help but just pause and read it repeatedly for several times. I did just like many of you have done when you have never read a scripture or read it for the first time from a different version.

In this verse, the Psalmist acknowledges first and foremost that he is fully aware of the fact that it was God that not only made him but also created him. I know this might burst the bubble of those who believe mankind evolved from a monkey; but the psalmist here knows very well that type of thinking is all wrong. There is no way you could make the psalmist even consider any part of the big bang theory. It takes more faith to believe in the big bang theory and evolution than it does to believe in creation and God as our creator. So, the psalmist makes this bold statement of declaring that it was God who made him who he is; and that God has every right to do whatever He wants without asking any one's permission. God also



created man; man did not create God. It does not come as a surprise to God as to our looks, our weakness, strengths, our blind spots, our pressure points, our fears or any other issues we might have. While God has known all about us before we even arrived here, we, on the other hand, are still learning about ourselves because of

the things that we go through on a day to day basis. How many times have you and I caught ourselves asking the question, "I don't know why I did that or responded that way?" Sadly, and honestly, this even happens after we are saved and sanctified. The Apostle Paul put it this way, "...the thing that I should do I find myself not doing and the thing that I shouldn't do I find myself doing." He calls himself a wretched man and asked the question, "...who will deliver him from this body of sin?" I am so clad that he answers his own question by so glad that he answers his own question by letting us all know that he must give thanks to

God who is not only his help, but ours as well.

I take it that Paul understood this verse from the Book of Psalms as well. He must have also asked God to give him the sense to follow His commands. In so doing, he could derive his answer to this most puzzling dilemma of why he responds in certain situations as he does. Keep in mind that this comes from a man who not only read and studied the Old Testament, but also wrote nearly half of the New Testament. He, like the Psalmist, understood that it's not in any of us to naturally follow God's commands; even if they are not grievous. If Adam had a problem following God's one command, what's the likelihood that you and I can obey just the 10 commandments? You see why we need God to give us the sense?



- That ye may walk honestly toward them that are without, and that ye may have lack of nothing.


QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

 This is the last lesson in this quarter dealing with Christian Commitment in Today's World. In the month of June, the Sunday school lessons focused on, "The Nature of Christian Commitment." The first lesson dealt with the Christian commitment-"Visible for God"; the second lesson dealt with the Christian commitment-"Pleasing to God"; the third lesson dealt with the Christian commitment-"Sustained through Encouragement"; and the lesson for today deals with Christian commitment"Demonstrated in Action". Since these lessons are taken from the first four chapters of 1 Thessalonians, what was going on in the church at Thessalonica that is similar to what is going on in the Church today that Paul's letter is applicable now as it was then?


THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

- 2. In 1 Thessalonians 4:3, Paul declares that it is the will of God for the church to be sanctified (sanctification)? What is meant by sanctification and is this a term expressed frequently across the pulpit? Why or why not?
- 3. Also in Thessalonians 4:3, Paul commands that the members of the church at Thessalonica "...abstain from fornication." What is "fornication" in a general sense? What are the manifestations or examples of "fornication" during the early church and in the world today? What current law being pressed by Christians today that addresses some forms of "fornication"? Do you agree or disagree with this proposed law?
- 4. In Thessalonians 4:6, Paul directs the Thessalonians, "That no man go beyond and defraud his brother in any matter: because that the Lord is the avenger of all such,..." How does a man or a woman defraud or "cheat" his spouse through adultery, a form of "fornication"? How does a man or a woman defraud or "cheat" his future spouse through pre-marital sex, also a form of "fornication"? Since God is the avenger of all such (behavior), what to you think are the consequences of adultery on married couples; what do you think are the consequences of pre-marital sex on future husbands and wives? Are there any other consequences that may affect other family members or future family members?
 - 5. In Thessalonians 4:11, Paul tells the church to "study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands,..." Is Paul only talking about their behavior within the church body, or is he addressing a more broader arena-the home, the church, and the community? What do you think? Why is it necessary for one to "study to be quiet"? Is Paul addressing only church matters, or is he also addressing matters of the home, the community, and even the world? Paul also seems to be very concerned about people in the church working to take care of their own family business. What do we have in government today that sometimes "undermines" this command? What should the Christian's position be concerning welfare? What role should the church play in assisting its members and people who are without?


