





BIRTHDAYS OF FAMOUS AFRICAN AMERICANS



March 2 - GEORGE "MULE" SUTTLES (March 31, 1901 - July 9, 1966) was an american first baseman and outfielder in negro league baseball, most prominently with the birmingham black barons, st. Louis stars and newark eagles. Best known for his power hitting, suttles was elected to the baseball hall of fame

Great negro league power hitter. Known in some circles as "the black babe ruth."



March 4 - GARRETT A. MORGAN (March 4, 1877 - July 27, 1963) was an American inventor and community leader. He was the subject of a newspaper feature in Cleveland, Ohio, for a heroic rescue in 1916 of workers trapped in a water intake tunnel, 50 ft beneath Lake Erie. He performed his rescue using a hood to protect his eyes from smoke and a series of tubes to draw clean air beneath the smoke. This enabled Morgan to lengthen his ability to endure the inhospitable conditions. Other inventions of Horgan's include the development of a chemical for hair-straightening. Horgan is also credited as the first African American in Cleveland to own an automobile. American inventor. Best known for creating the devices known today as the gas mask and traffic light.



March 17 - NATHANIEL ADAMS COLES (March 17, 1919 - February 15, 1965), known professionally as Nat King Cole, was an American jazz planist and vocalist. He recorded over one hundred songs that became hits on the pop charts. His trio was the model for small jazz ensembles that followed. Cole also acted in films and on television and performed on Broadway. He was the first black man to host an American television series. Legendary jazz musician and singer. First Black American to have a network television show.

A SALUTE TO BILLY GRAHAM BYTHE BOOK, by Anthony Cook:

ANTHONY COOK years ago in recognition of the dedication of the Billy Graham Library.

My grandmother was a fan of Billy Graham. The long-time television evangelist was a regular visitor in our living room when I was growing up. But I remember groaning whenever he was on the television. As a child, I didn't like him. We had five channels and no remote, so channel-surfing wasn't really an option.

Graham's delivery seemed so dry to me. He couldn't keep my attention long

enough for me to get the message. I wasn't entertained. Maybe it was BLLY because he didn't "work" the pulpit. He didn't work himself into a frenzy, yelling into the microphone, running from one side of the pulpit to the other, and out into the audience — dancing, moaning, spitting, wailing. His sermons didn't build to a rhythmic climax with the seeming purpose of driving the crowd wild. The ministry wasn't about entertainment with Billy Graham. He wasn't like that. But neither was Jesus.

The greatest sermon ever preached was the "Sermon on the Mount." The Bible says a multitude of people followed Jesus up a mountainside. When he reached the summit, he sat down and taught the people. (Matt. 5:1-2) No yelling. No running around, working up a sweat. No show business. Simple.

Graham — as should be the case with all preachers — took his cues from Jesus. Time after time, he stood at a podium in the midst of thousands of people and, when he wasn't talking, there was near silence.

When he did talk, it was the pure gospel. He opened the Bible and kept it open, expounding on Scripture verse-by-verse. He peppered his sermons with anecdotes that "forced people to see themselves and where they stood with God. And in no uncertain terms, he delivered powerful, convicting messages over and over, decade after decade for 68 years. Simple. Effective. And at the conclusion of every message, without fail, Graham made the invitation to accept Christ as Lord and Savior. The invitation

seems to be a lost art these days. Maybe some ministers think it gets in the way of the show, but the opposite is true. The show gets in the way of the

The purpose of the gospel is to reach the lost. There's no reason to come to Christ until you realize you're in need of help that only he can provide. The purpose of a sermon should not be to excite a crowd, but to expose individuals to the hopelessness of themselves and to the good news of Jesus Christ. Graham's sermons did

that. Whenever he made the invitation at the close of a televised message, people would respond in "droves. According to news reports this week, his work has reached more than 210 million people in

And why was he in the news this week? No, he's not dead. He's 88, and all three living ex-presidents were on hand Thursday to dedicate the Billy Graham Library in his honor.


None of this is to say he's a perfect man. None of us is. But, hopefully, the world appreciates how he delivered such a pure message for so many years. I didn't when I was growing up. I do now.





Through The Four Gospels

Easter arrives on the first Sunday in April this year - April 1, 2018. There were many events some 2000 years ago coming up to that first day of the week - Sunday, when Mary Magdalene went to the tomb in search of her Lord and our Lord, Jesus Christ. The following scriptures from the four gospels - Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, contain small segments of the Easter Story that should encourage and challenge many to seek THE LAMB OF GOD TO TAKES AWAY THE SIN OF THE WORLD - Jesus, the Christ! (Read the following chapters in each of the four Gospels for a more complete view of the REASON FOR CELEBRATING EASTER: (1) Matthew 26th - 28th chapters; Mark 15th - 16th chapters; Luke 22nd - 24th chapters; and John 17th – 20th chapters)

Matthew 26:1-16 (NK,N)—JESUS TELLS HIS DISCIPLES THAT HE IS GOING TO BE CRUCIFIED; JUDAS PLOTS TO BETRAY JESUS TO THE CHIEF PRIESTS



The First African American Cowboy Inducted into The National Cowboy Hall Of Fame

THE BLACK COWBOY MUSEUM



William "Bill" Pickett was born December 5, 1870, in Travis County, near Austin, TX. He was a cowboy, rodeo, wild west performer and actor. Bill Pickett is probably the most African famous American cowboy.

n 1989, Bill Pickett was inducted into THE PRO-RODEO HALL OF FAME.

The son of former slaves and one of thirteen children, Bill began roping and riding as a youngster. After completing the fifth grade, he found work as a ranch hand to help support the family. Bill's dad, Thomas Jefferson Pickett, worked hard on ranches. He married a former slave named Mary "Jamie" Gilbert. Bill Pickett had four brothers and eight sisters. The family's ancestry was African American and Cherokee. By 1888, the family had moved to Taylor, TX. In 1890, at the age of 20, Pickett married Maggie Turner, a former slave and daughter of a white southern plantation owner. They had nine children.

Although steer wrestling did not actually originate from Bill Pickett (men were grappling with the horns of bulls as early as 2400 BC), his original technique certainly helped establish "bulldogging" as a popular rodeo event. The skill of grabbing cattle by the horns and wrestling them to the ground with the help of a trained bulldog or cow dog, a stray steer could be thrown to the ground. Pickett had seen this happen many times.

One day Bill got so mad at this stubborn cow that he was trying to catch he lost his rope and decided to jump from his horse and wrestle the steer to the ground. He was so mad he thought that if a bulldog could hit the cow in the nose, so could he; and he did! Bil Pickett's method of "bulldogging" is called "steer wrestling" in Pro-Rodeo today. But in some rodeos, it is still called "bulldogging".

Bill Pickett soon became know for his tricks and stunts at local community fairs With his four brothers, he established THE PICKETT BROTHERS BRONCO BUSTERS & ROUGH RIDERS ASSOCIATION. Bill did his "bulldogging" act traveling about in Texas, Arizona, Wyoming, and Oklahoma.

In 1905, Bill Pickett joined the 101 RANCH WILD WEST SHOW featuring Buffalo Bill Will Roger, Tom Mix, and Lucille Mulhall. Bill performed under the name, "The Dusky Demon". He performed around the world in the wild west show. Pickett's ethnicity resulted in him not being able to appear in many rodeos stateside; so, he often was forced to claim that he was of Comanche heritage in order to perform in rodeos in his own country.

On March 19, 1932, Bill was breaking a horse at the 101 RANCH when he was kicked in the head by the horse. After 14 days in a coma, Bill Pickett died at the hospital in Oklahoma at the age of 61. In 1971, Bill Pickett became the first African American cowboy inducted into THE NATIONAL COWBOY HALL OF FAME. The ANNUAL BILL PICKETT INVITATIONAL RODEO, dedicated to African American cowboys and cowgirls honors his name and his contributions to the rodeo profession.


