

Happy Birthday, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. A Special Salute to a Great American Hero

When is Martin Luther King Day 2019? Martin Luther King, Jr. day will be celebrated on Monday, January 21, 2019.

What is Martin Luther King Day?

Martin Luther King Day is a United States federal holiday. It is celebrated annually on the third Monday of January and is also known as King Day or MLK Day. In some states it is also commonly referred to as Civil Rights Day or Human Rights Day. In recent years it is increasingly seen to be a 'Day of Service' when Americans are encouraged to volunteer to help others less fortunate than themselves.

Martin Luther King Day commemorates the birthday of American civil rights leader Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and celebrates his life, achievements and legacy.

King was hugely influential in the American Civil Rights Movement

(despite never holding public office) and was a major advocate of nonviolent activism in the struggle for the end of racial discrimination under US law. He was assassinated in 1968.

This federal holiday in King's honor was created in 1983, during the presidency of Ronald Reagan, and first observed in January 1986.





Prayers have been going up for many years that God would do a deep work among us in order to bring healing and revival in our midst. Suicide, family violence, drugs and gangs are tearing our families apart, not to mention the fact that our churches are losing an entire generation in our pews! We need REVIVAL! Revival begins with US, and the purpose of this email is to invite you to attend a breakfast on the day Americans honor "the peace maker - Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The breakfast will be held at the Embassy Church (formerly First Assembly of God) located at 2512 Avenue in Rosenberg (across from Taylor Ray Elementary) on Monday, January 21st at 8:30 am. King was awarded at least fifty honorary degrees from colleges and universities.[303] On October 14, 1964, King became the youngest recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize, which was awarded to him for leading nonviolent resistance to racial prejudice in the U.S.[304] In 1965, he was awarded the American Liberties Medallion by the American Jewish Committee for his "exceptional advancement of the principles of human liberty".[303] [305] In his acceptance remarks, King said, "Freedom is one thing. You have it all or you are not free."[306]

In 1957, he was awarded the Spingarn Medal from the NAACP.[307] Two years later, he won the Anisfield-Wolf Book Award for his book Stride Toward Freedom: The Montgomery Story.[308] In 1966, the Planned Parenthood Federation of America awarded King the Margaret Sanger Award for "his courageous resistance to bigotry and his lifelong dedication to the advancement

of social justice and human dignity".[309] Also in 1966, King was elected as a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.[310] In November 1967 he made a 24-hour trip to the United Kingdom to receive an honorary degree from Newcastle University, being the first African-American to be so honoured by Newcastle.[311] In a moving impromptu acceptance speech,[312] he said "There are three urgent and indeed great problems that we face not only in the United States of America but all over the world today. That is the problem of racism, the problem of poverty and the problem of war. In 1971 he was posthumously awarded a Grammy Award for

Best Spoken Word Album for his Why I Oppose the War in Vietnam.[313] In 1977, the Presidential Medal of Freedom was posthumously awarded to King by President Jimmy

Carter. The citation read: Martin Luther King Jr. was the conscience of his generation. He gazed upon the great wall of segregation and saw that the power

of love could bring it down. From the

pain and exhaustion of his fight to

fulfill the promises of our founding fathers for our humblest citizens, he wrung his eloquent statement of his dream for America. He made our nation stronger because he made it better. His dream sustains us yet.[314]

King and his wife were also awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 2004.[315]

King was second in Gallup's List of Most Widely Admired People of the 20th Century.[316] In 1963, he was named Time Person of the Year, and in 2000, he was voted sixth in an online "Person of the Century" poll by the same magazine. [317] King placed third in the Greatest American contest conducted by the Discovery Channel and AOL.[318]

PRMC is also affiliated with Heart International. PRMC is currently under the directorship of Lisa Pearson with an Assistant Director, Trina Powers. Collaborations have also been established with Kroger and Pandal's reward cards to link purchase percentage benefits to PRMC. Additionally, when supporters shop Amazon Smile and choose, "Charity PRMC," 0.5 % of the purchase price will be donated to PRMC. There are also three annual fundraising events: The Fall Gala—"Benefit for Life", "Baby Bottle Boomerang," and the "End of the Year Appeals Letter." Appeals Letter."



The Bible is replete with do overs; starting all the way back to the beginning when our very first parents messed up in the garden. The stage was now set for mankind to take a do over through Jesus Christ to get us back to where Adam and Eve took us from. Then of course, there is the nation of Israel. Let's deal with them in the Book of Judges where there are plenty of do overs. I call this book the "see- saw" book because there are people who were devoted to God one minute; and then, the next minute they are walking away from God when they are oppressed by an opposing nation. Immediately they cry out to God and He sends a "deliverer"; and as long as that "deliverer" is alive, they go back to being devoted to God. I take it that those Israelites that were now led and called by the tribe of Judah also didn't learn anything from Israel going into captivity. The entire book of Jeremiah is about God warning Judah that because of their disobedience, they too were about to go into captivity just like Israel did. These circumstances give us insight into the meaning of God sending Jeremiah to the Potter's House to let Judah know that God will have to do this damaged nation over again. Maybe you feel as though you damaged some things or even some relationships in 2018? Well, God says through the prophet Jeremiah that just as the Potter had to make a do over with what he was making that day, God will sometimes have to make a do over His children who have been damaged or who has caused damage by their disobedience and sin. God wants you and I to first learn from those things we damaged and then allow Him to make a do over for us as well in 2019. The only question now is, will we allow Him to go through that entire process; no matter what it looks like to do just that?


Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever!

One of the reasons why 87% of the graduates at RestorationCity, 5 years after graduation, are still living productive lives and plugged in to the local church is because the program incorporates real life situations into the 12-month residential stay.

For example, two of our students who both recently entered the re-entry phase of the program found gainful employment within a week of conducting their job searches. 

can't believe I did such a thing. How could I do such a thing? He said I was going to do it, but I didn't believe him. I just could not have imagined I would ever do such a thing. I am so embarrassed and ashamed. I have made such a fool of myself. How can I ever show my face in public again? What will my friends and companions think of me now? Will they ever accept me back into their fellowship or forgive me? More importantly, will Jesus my Master and best friend ever forgive me?

These were probably some of the thoughts that entered Peter's mind immediately after he denied knowing the Lord on the night Jesus was betrayed and turned over to his enemies. To refresh our memory, when our Lord was betrayed by Judas and turned over to his enemies in the Garden of Gethsemane, the other disciples forsook him and fled. According to Matthew and John's Gospel accounts, Peter had made an effort to

While our Lord was being questioned and tried in the residence of the high priest, Peter was standing outside in the crowd warming himself by the fire when someone accused him of being a follower of Christ Peter promptly denied knowing Jesus. Later on someone else identified Peter as a disciple of Jesus, and again he promptly denied knowing Jesus. Yet a third time Peter was identified as a follower of Jesus, and for the third time he denied knowing Jesus. According to some accounts Peter cursed and swore that he did not know Jesus. According to Luke's Gospel, at the very moment of his third denial, Jesus turned and looked directly at Peter. Then Peter remembered our Lord's prediction that before the cock crowed that very day Peter would three times deny knowing the Lord. Then Peter immediately went off by himself and wept bitterly.

I would imagine that the night of his denial of Jesus was the worst and loneliest night that Peter ever spent in his life. He had before made a number of blunders and had embarrassed himself on any number of occasions. Even a casual reading of the Gospels reveals Peter's inclination to have foot-inmouth disease. However, all his efforts, faults, and failures notwithstanding, his denial of Jesus was by far his most grievous, embarrassing, and shameful act.

During the course of our lives we all make a number of mistakes, any one of which could wreak havoc with our lives and our faith. But there are some



Don't Let Anything Stop Your Growth

that stand out as the most embarrassing and shameful that, more than all the others, have the potential to wreck our faith, our lives, our careers, our families, our marriages, and our relationships. Some wounds cut more deeply than others. Some exposures cause more embarrassment than others do. Some things, if they were to come to the light of day, would cause more shame than others would. Some things seem almost unforgivable and unrecoverable in the sight of others if they were ever discovered.

How do you continue to hold your head up and continue to function as a husband, wife, friend, father, mother, sister, brother, minister, Pastor, teacher, doctor, lawyer, social worker, professional, or president when you hand has been caught in the "cookie jar" and everybody knows it? How do you continue to look people in the eye when your business is out in the street and everybody knows it? How do you relate to people knowing that they know some of your private failures but not knowing what they are thinking when they are looking at you in the eye? When the truth gets out and you cannot deny it any longer, how do you look at people in the face when you know and they know that you have betrayed their trust in you? What do you do when you feel lower than low? That was the reality Peter faced on the night in which he denied knowing the Lord.

Perhaps that was why Peter received his own personal invitation to behold his risen Lord in Mark's Gospel of the message that the angels delivered to the women who went to the tomb to anoint the body of the Lord on that first Sunday after the Lord's crucifixion. According to the text, the angels told the women to "go, tell his disciples and Peter that (Jesus) is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." Peter's pain and shame were so deep – and God was so loving and forgiving – that the angels called his name specifically to let him know that he name specifically to let him know that he was forgiven, and that Jesus still loved him. And if anyone asked him how he could dare face Jesus after what he did, Peter could always say that he was there because he was personally invited to behold his risen Lord. The words of the text were also an invitation for Peter to grow beyond his shame and his pride and to maintain his place of leadership in the fellowship where he belonged. 

LET GOD PLANT YOU AND SEE HOW MUCH YOU WILL GROW,

A farmer walks threw his fields dropping seeds on top of the soil. He takes a moment to talk to God about what he had planted and asks him to do the rest. Off he sanders to the barn to grab the water hose to wet the seeds that he has just laid out. Optimism and opportunity arise in his soul as he watches the cold wetness wash over the seeds in promise and hope. Days later the roots begin to push their way out of the castings and into the hard-packed



Seeds settle where they are, they don't move unless someone moves them. They plant roots where the farmer or gardener takes care of them. Over the last half of the year the word "Settle" has taken root in my heart. According to dictionary.com one of the many definitions of the word settle is, "To take up residence." However, there was one other definition that I found that resonated within me, "To adopt a more steady or secure style of life, especially in a permanent job or home." In May 2017 I moved back home after my college graduation. Moving back was hard because I felt like God had told me that I wasn't done in San Marcos yet, but at the time I didn't have the funds to stay. In the months that followed I fought a lot of discontentment and change in my life. I had moved back in with my parents, started my first big girl job, started a new church, and moved back to a town that had changed a lot over the four years I was gone. With all the sudden changes I struggled my first year back in Rosenberg. Over time God had to remind me that, "Rosenberg can be beautiful too". It wasn't till May 2018, a year later, that my perspective began to change. My heart is still set on going back to the Hill Country, but God said, "Stop. Look around".

At the end of July, the word, "settle," floated into my heart. I wrestled with this word because no one likes to settle. Settle has a negative connotation that is associated with it. Quotes we typically hear with the word settle are, "Don't settle for less than God's best" "Are you ready to settle down?" "Don't settle for just any guy or girl. Don't lower your standards". What if the perspective was changed on the word "settle"? What if "settling" isn't a bad thing?

What if settling where God has asked you to be will grow you? Like in the story above, God showed the farmer where to plant the seed and to leave it there even in his doubts. He had to keep working for the seeds to grow.

If we look back at the Old Testament God repeatedly asked his followers to settle in a town or city for a season. One example would be when the Lord is talking to Isaac in the book of Genesis. Genesis 26:2-3, "Do not go down to

stay in this land for a while, and I will be with you and bless you." (Emphasis mine). The Lord is asking Isaac to settle in Gerar because He wanted to fulfill his promise to Abraham. (vs 3). Due to Isaac's obedience, God blessed him abundantly. (vs 12-16). I feel like when we decide to follow God's directive, we tend to get impatient and want God to perform in our time; but God doesn't work like that. In verse 9 it states, "When Isaac had been there a long time [...]". Isaac had to settle there and wait on God to fulfill his promise. When we follow in obedience it is not about us, but about what God will do through us in that time.

I have learned over the last few months that settling is about letting God use you where he has placed you. When it comes to settling, we must change our mindset from pouting to, "I know God has me here for a reason. Let me look for that reason rather than sit in my discontentment." I believe it is about submitting to God's authority in our lives rather than our own. Over the last several months, I've had to remind myself that he is working; and that I can't move until he gives me the directive. If I try to move before he has told me, He will just turn me back around like he did with Jonah when He asked Jonah to go to Nineveh and Jonah rebelled.

2 Samuel 7:10 reads, "And I will provide a place for my people Israel and will plant them so that they can have a home of their own and no longer be disturbed." As I read through the different verses that spoke about God asking his people to settle, someplace I noticed that he said he will provide for them. He never left His people alone where he placed them. As I looked back over this last year and a half, I can see how that promise has played out in my life. He provided the resources for me to move out on my own, furniture to turn a house into a home, people to do life with, and new dreams. He's growing me where he has planted me. However, anything that we plant must be nurtured. We must soak in the life-giving nutrients that God gives us. He places people, circumstances, and challenges in our life so that we can grow from them. He gives us his Word in order to draw strength. Worship allows us to find the words we didn't know how to speak. He is a good father who gives us what we need for the place he has asked us to be. Without those nutrients, we won't be able to identify the reason that God has us where he has us. So, as this new year comes rolling in, what is God asking you to plant roots in? Is it in a new job, city, or family? Plant yourself and allow God to water you. He won't let you shrivel up, he will rise you up.



MR. LARRY CALLIES, FOUNDER AND CEO OF THE BLACK COWBOY MUSEUM, ROSENBERG, TX



We are here this afternoon interviewing Mr. Larry Callies, Founder and CEO

of the Black Cowboy Museum in Rosenberg,

G 0 0 D NEWS: Good Afternoon, Mr. Callies.

CALLIES: Good Afternoon. GOOD NEWS:

thank you in advance for taking out time from your busy schedule for this interview. My understanding is that the BLACK COWBOY MUSEUM here in Rosenberg, TX, is the only one of its kind in the entire United States. I believe our readers would really enjoy reading about your life and how you came to be the founder of this BLACK COWBOY MUSEUM.

GOOD NEWS: Mr. Callies, could give us a little background information about yourself?

CALLIES: I was born November 12, 1952, in El Campo, TX. My father's name was Leon Callies. He was also known as "Puggy". My daddy was a rancher and a farmer. During the winter months, he tended cattle. And during the spring and summer months, he grew cotton and corn as a farmer. My mother's name was Inell Callies. She was a housewife taking care of the family. I had three brothers and a sister. Out of all my brothers, I was the only one to come out as a cowboy. My daddy put me on a horse when I was three years old. When I was around 9 or 10 years old, I would go with my daddy to tend the cattle. I did this mainly to keep out of the cotton fields. I would have to fill one of those long sacks with cotton which would take me the entire summer to do. And at the end, I believed I only received \$5.00 for all that work. Needless to say, I did not want to work in the cotton fields.

GOOD NEWS: How long did you live in El Campo, TX?

CALLIES: Not long. Even though I was born in El Campo, I was raised in Boling, TX, after we had moved there when I was in the third grade. My daddy moved our entire family to Boling, TX, to work for the largest rancher in Wharton, TX—Mr. Slone Williams. He was a stock producer who took cattle to area rodeos for competition. I eventually graduated from Boling High School in 1971. While there at the high school, I was the second black to make it to the state rodeo championship in calf roping.

GOOD NEWS: While your family was working on the Slone Williams Ranch, did Mr. Williams take his stock to the HOUSTON LIVESTOCK SHOW & RODEO?

CALLIES: No, it wasn't called that then. He did take cattle to Houston for rodeo events; but they took place at the Houston coliseum at that

GOOD NEWS: What did your father do on the Sloan Williams ranch?

CALLIES: Besides tending the stock and other ranching duties, my father was an expert calf-roper. He was able to participate in calfroping in some of the small local rodeos and won several of them. During those days, even though he was an expert calf-roper, he was not allowed to participate in the organized write rodeos.

GOOD NEWS: How did your father develop the talent to be a calf-roper?

CALLIES: My father learned how to be a cowboy from my uncle who was called BIG PREACHER WILLIAMS who was from El Campo, TX. He was known as the "best cowboy" in the country—the best saddle bronc rider without a doubt

GOOD NEWS: Did he participate in rodeos back then?

CALLIES: No, back in the 40's, 50's, and 60's, they would not allow black cowboys to participate in the organized white rodeos. But everybody in this country knew that BIG PREACHER was the best. Those smaller local rodeos where they had jackpots and smaller type awards, he participated in them and won many of them. In the 1960's, his son, TEX WILLIAMS, proved that he was the best—"the chip off the old block!" TEX WILLIAMS was allowed to participate in the white rodeos in 1967 while a student at El Campo High School and he won state championship in 1967 and 1968 while there. He was BIG PREACHER'S son; he was my cousin.

GOOD NEWS: Where there many other blacks participating in the rodeos back then?

CALLIES: Not many. There was a Sammie Ray Phillips from West Columbia who was a pretty good calf-roper in the 1970's and he also went to the state rodeo competition. But he didn't win the championship.

GOOD NEWS: Okay. So, after you graduated from Boling High School, what did you do?

CALLIES: I went to Wharton County Junior College. While I was there, I did participate in the Wharton County Junior College Rodeo.

GOOD NEWS: Did you win any events then?

CALLIES: No. Nothing major, just some small little awards and jackpots. But I was the Vice-President of the Wharton County Junior College Rodeo Club back in 1971.

GOOD NEWS: Did you graduate from Wharton County Junior College?

CALLIES: No. I did not. I quit and decided to get a job and go to work. I worked at the Baylor Co. which dealt with oil rigs and products. I worked there for a couple of years and then got a job working at the United States Post Office as a mailman. I spent 34 years working at the Post Office and retired in 2010.

GOOD NEWS: Did you do any rodeos while you were working at the post office?

CALLIES: No, not at first. I got back into the rodeo starting in 2000 and continued through 2010. From about 1980 to 2000, I entered a brief but promising singing career.

GOOD NEWS: How did you go from being in rodeos to having a singing career?

CALLIES: I entered a contest in 1984 and was in the top three winners at a Bear Creek Competition. That's when George Strait's manager, Erb Wooley, saw me at the contest and was planning to sign me with a contract with MCA records. Two weeks before I was to sign the contract, I lost my voice to something called "spasmodic vocal dysphonia"—it's a neurological disorder affecting the voice muscles in the larynx, or voice box or your vocal chords. I had to take Botox shots just to be able to talk. Of course, this pretty much ended my singing career. (END OF PART ONE OF MR. LARRY CALLIES, FOUNDER & CEO OF THE BLACK COWBOY MUSEUM.)
